



Word Work

- Letter and Sound knowledge Students practise identifying sounds and letter patterns to decode words and create fluency when reading and writing.
- Spelling Students are guided through the Oxford Word List to develop a bank of high frequency words that can be used in reading and writing.
 Students use the strategy of Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check (LSCWC) to learn to spell personal words from their writing. Students have access to resources in the classroom, eg; word charts, dictionaries and environmental print.
- Grammar Is taught as a whole class, small group or individual basis depending on the needs of the class/students.

Home Learning

- It is expected that students read a 'Just-Right-Book' on a regular basis for a sustained period of time, e.g. Students in Years 3-6 can read independently for 30 minutes per night.
- Reading also includes viewing, talking about books and complete a response after reading.
- Home Learning books can include take home reading books from school, library books (school or local) and books from home.
- Students record their reading in a Reading Journal/Diary.
