Leadership Team Report

This week is National Reconciliation Week which gives Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people the chance to come together and share the steps to-wards reconciliation. This is a time when we celebrate and build on the relationships shared be-tween Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and other Australians. It is also a great opportunity to reflect on our shared histories, contributions and achievements. This week teachers and students have been exploring this via their classroom programs and will continue this work into next week.

Some advance notice for families this week that in the last two weeks of this term we will be trialling a slightly different structure for our school day than the one we have been using for the last few years. The new structure will contain the same amount of classroom time, sessions and total break time but use two longer breaks during the day, a longer morning session (before Break 1) and shorter afternoon session (after Break 2).

We are trialling this new structure for a couple of weeks based on feedback from both teachers and students. Students have told us that they would like longer to play outside and teachers are aware that the mornings, and in particular the start of the day, are the most productive time of the day. This changed structure lengthens the time outside and gives longer time in class between breaks. We are aware that some students may need additional food or brain breaks during the longer morning session and teachers will be mindful of this. At the start of Term 3 we will go back to the old structure and then gather some feedback as to what the pros and cons have been. We will give a further a reminder before we try this at the end of term.



School Savings Bonus - Time to allocate your funds!

Please note it is time to allocate your School Saving Bonus (SSB) for any Uniform Purchases

It seems that some parents have received an error when trying to allocate \$ amounts to uniforms on the portal. This is to do with the school having its own in-house uniform shop and a glitch with the portal thinking we have an external uniform shop.

As a way to get around this we are asking families to log into the portal and choose to allocate the full \$400 funds to the school activities option. The \$400 will come into your family account as a credit and we will be able to process the funds to either uniforms, contributions or activities, whichever you choose at the time. Eg if you purchased \$100 worth of uniforms at the start of next year, \$300 balance will be sitting in your account as remaining credit to use for perhaps contributions a camp/excursion or activity for your child later in the year.

Uniform purchase will be available until June 2025, from July any balances of SSB will only be able to be used for excursions and activities.

If you have already made uniform purchases, please access your portal and allocate your SSB to the school.
